Standing in the queue to pay for our delicious, cooked breakfast in Chilbolton village shop the other morning (if you haven't sampled one of Nicky's tasty dishes, then you really MUST!!), a lovely man stopped to tell me he would miss me when I move to Devon in late September. Thank you all.

One thing that helps me to counter the sense of loss I feel as my decade among you as Rector of The Downs Benefice comes to a close, is that our shared faith in Jesus Christ will guide us all into the 'unknown' of our futures, with the deepest love the world has ever known. There is the story of a man on a Safari deep in the African jungle. Weary with heat and frustration, he cries out to the Tour Guide 'Where are we?' The guide stops his work beating through the dense undergrowth with a machete and replies, 'I am the path.' In our journey of faith with God, we also ask this question at times when our lives seem unclear and the path difficult to see. We ask God, 'Where are you taking me?' God's answer to our cries for help and direction is to give us His Son, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

At the end of His earthly ministry, Matthew's Gospel gives us this tender dialogue between Jesus and his disciples: 'And remember that I am always with you until the end of time.' When Jesus speaks these words to the disciples who have also become his close friends, He is about to face his own death.

Even in this desperate situation, Jesus offers the disciples and each of us a way to find a more meaningful life on earth that will lead to eternal life with Christ. He is the right pathway! Wherever the journey of our lives takes us, if we keep Jesus as the way, the truth and the life, we will always tread on sure ground and know the grace of His love guiding and protecting us through every twist and turn we face.

I very much pray that I will meet many of you again. I trust the Lord that I will. Darren and I will only be in Devon and look forward to seeing you if you ever come down to Kingsbridge. We leave you with the words of William Shakespeare who says, 'Farewell! God knows when we shall meet again.'

May God bless each of you and keep you, and make His face to shine upon you and bring you His peace, now and forever more, and with my love, always,

Chilbolton Parish Council Report

We have had a quiet July with some rather poor weather but hopefully August will be much better.

Not a lot to report this month but first, a reminder of the public meeting arranged for 14th September at 7pm at the Village Hall, to receive presentations from the Tunnel Tech management on the modifications to overcome the smell. The smell emitted by the Tunnel Tech plant processing compost for mushroom cultivation has caused distress to village residents for at least 10 years and work is in progress to enclose part of the process that we hope should reduce the noxious smell. The management team from Tunnel Tech will answer questions after their presentation. All those who have been affected are encouraged to attend.

Cow Common continues to be our greatest asset and concern and some people with disabilities have asked for more information about access and parking. The problem is that visitors using the parking area have selfishly ignored the no parking signs, removed dragon's teeth and blocked access to the houses on the common. There have also been many cases of irresponsible behaviour.

The common is private land owned by the parish council but is also a registered common and an SSSI. It is, of course, open to all. However, the Parish Council is bound to permit unrestricted access for resident's vehicles and delivery and emergency vehicles.

After several public consultation meetings and much discussion, the parking space has been restricted with a changed layout and a lockable barrier installed. The open spaces committee manages the common and benefits from a grant from Natural England but is bound by regulations from the Environment Agency for SSSs.

With full support of the parish council, COSC has decided to close the barrier over the school holidays and the months of June, July and August. We realise that this could be a problem for those with disabilities and if this causes anyone a problem please contact our clerk and we will try to find a solution.

CHILBOLTON WAR MEMORIAL PLAYING FIELD DEVELOPMENT GROUP NEWS

....and good news it is too!

As soon as we had finalised plans for the installation of the table tennis table we started research and planning for our most ambitious addition to the facilities yet: an adventure tower.

Having had our proposal agreed by the Parish Council late last year, we applied to the TVBC Community Asset fund for a 50% grant in early January 2023. After very careful consideration the full grant we requested was offered and an order has been placed with Caledonia Play for a three-tower wooden structure incorporating a range of additional activities to suit children up to early secondary school age.

Visitors will have noticed that, notwithstanding its popularity with children (and the odd adult), the slide mound is showing its age and signs of wear so to prepare for the adventure tower installation (hopefully) in mid-September, we will remove the mound by the end of August. The adventure tower will include a slide and tunnel. The short wait without a slide should be well worthwhile!

That in turn will mean that we can use the soil as part of the construction of a cycle bumps track - another item included in our medium-term plan presented to the Parish Council for their endorsement in 2020. We are very pleased to have the assistance of a local, experienced bike bump track rider for its design.

The plan is to accomplish all of this from funds already set aside by the parish council to develop the CWMPF facilities, and the generous grant from TVBC...BUT...in order to provide an optimal cycle bumps track we will need additional soil and that is where readers of this can help. If you have, or know of, unwanted soil please communicate with us via the parish clerk – chibolton.clerk@hotmail.co.uk.

If you have any questions or would like an update on our progress with the project it will be great to hear from you, via the parish clerk. In the meantime, we'll be concentrating on delivering these major improvements for those enjoying the CWMPF and its facilities.

Stockbridge Practice Patient News – August 2023



We are currently continuing our system of having a waiting list for patients who want to see a specific GP who doesn't currently have any available appointments.

We hope this is improving patient continuity and reducing calls into the surgery. We welcome any feedback on this new system.

Starting Boarding School or University?

If you are starting at boarding school or moving away for university, please ensure you register permanently with a GP who is local to you there. If you are unwell when you are living back at home, you can register as a temporary patient. Schools or nurseries should ensure prescribed medication is named but if your child takes over the counter medication this does not need to be prescribed.

GP Patient Survey 2023

Thank you to all patients who contributed to the national GP patient survey. We are pleased that the 2023 National GP Surgery has shown that 89% of patient report their overall experience at Stockbridge Practice is good. We have seen a reported increase in patients saying it is easy to get through on the telephones and that they find our website easy to use.

Social Prescriber

We have a Social Prescriber called Sarah Armstrong working at the Practice. She can help patients who have social issues which are impacting on their mental and/or physical health such as housing, finances, loneliness etc. Sarah accepts self-referrals.


Firearms licences

Sandra Rosemary Brown (Sandy) (1944-2023)

Sandy Brown (nee Standfield) was born in Stockbridge on 28th January 1944, the only girl in the family with three brothers - Brian (Bucky), Stuart and Jim. Sandy went to Stockbridge school where, unsurprisingly, one of her favourite subjects was cookery.

Sandy was fifteen years old when she left school and she went to work at Portals in Overton where the bank notes were made.

She married the love of her life, Rex Arthur Brown, on 16th March 1963, and they lived for a while with Rex's mother in Tovey's Cottage in Wherwell, before moving to Chapel Court. Sandy & Rex had two boys, Robert in 1965 and Shawn in 1966, and the family later moved to Beech Grove in Wherwell.

When the boys started growing up, she became a dinner lady and then head cook at Wherwell school. She loved working at the school and would always spoil the children with extra portions of dinner and pudding!

Sandy's husband Rex passed away on Christmas Day, 1989.

After leaving Wherwell school, she went on to work for Hampshire County council and then Mencap where she cared for old and disabled people. She would take them on days out and would also take them on many holidays. Sandy also did the catering for a lot of the village functions - cricket teas, weddings, parties and funerals, her buffets were always very popular.

Sandy loved helping people in the village and surrounding areas and would often visit friends and take them out for the day or visit them in their care homes and give them a haircut or the gentlemen a shave to help make them feel better.

Sadly, Sandy died on 2nd July 2023 at the Rothsay Grange Nursing Home, after she had suffered with dementia for several years.

Sandy leaves behind her son Shawn, daughter-in-law Kim, grandsons Shawn and Leigh, great-grandson Rex, brothers Bucky and Jim and Debbie and Zoe. Sadly, in the past few months, there have been two bereavements of close family; her brother Stuart in December 2022 and her son Robert in May 2023.

Sandy was loved and respected by many people in the local area, and this was evident at her funeral, where the church was standing room only!



Tom England - the History of RAF 238 Squadron

Tom's talk begins with an overview of the key milestones in 238's operations, which include:

- Anti-Submarine Flying Boat Operations (1918-1922)
- Fighter Operations in defence of the UK, including the Battle of Britain (1940-1941)
- Ground Attack Operations in North African / Mediterranean (1941-1944)
- Air Transport Operations in Burma & the Far East (1944-1946)
- Air Transport Operations in Europe, including the Berlin Airlift (1946-1948)

Cucumber and courgette soup



A quick, delicious and healthy way of using the glut of courgettes at this time of year. I never thought raw courgettes would make an interesting soup but this is surprisingly good and takes only 10-15 minutes to make.

Ingredients for 4 - 5 people

1 large cucumber, peeled and roughly chopped

1-2 medium courgettes, unpeeled but with most of the seeds gouged out and roughly chopped

1 small to medium onion, roughly chopped

Large handful of chopped mint. You can't really overdo the mint Juice of half a lemon

1-2 cloves of garlic, depending on taste

I vegetable stock cube

Mug of water

Mug of cream, crème fraiche, sour cream or full fat Greek yoghurt.


Put the whole lot in the blender and whizz until smooth. I used to make stock from the cube first, before putting in the blender, until I realised you can simply crumble it in and add water. So much quicker!

It's great to have chilled on a hot day, with a swirl of cream and sprinkling of mint or chives. Also good eaten hot. In either case, buttered warm baguette or sourdough bread are delicious with it.
